Gamma Phi Gives Day Recognition & Fairfax Loyalty Grant Endowment

Dear Sisters,

We are so happy to share with you the amazing results from Gamma Phi Gives Day that helped continue to fund the Fairfax Loyalty Grant Endowment Gamma Phi Gives Day in total raised \$206,702 which goes directly to ensuring our members experience the leadership and educational opportunities that prepare them to be confident women of character.

This would not have been possible without the incredibly generous donations from our chapter members and other alumnae members that made this possible. We would like to recognize and thank all of our members for their generous donations on Gamma Phi Gives Day this year.

Our very own Margaret Myers (Colorado College), pledged to match gifts up to \$5,000 for the Fairfax Loyalty Grant Endowment. This endowment provides Loyalty Grants to collegians and alumnae enrolled in graduate programs and was able to provide funding for one of these Loyalty Grant just last year!

In combination with Margaret's generosity and the generosity of our fellow chapter members and other alumnae, we were able to raise \$11,191.44 for the Fairfax County Loyalty Grant Endowment! This is a tremendous accomplishment and one that we should be especially proud of because it directly supports our sisters most in need.

In 1993, Gamma Phi Beta Foundation Trustee and Fairfax County Alumnae Chapter Member, Joan Braitsch established a Scholarship Endowment, the Northern Virginia Challenge, and members of the Northern Virginia Alumnae Chapter generously participated in fundraisers until they reached the required \$15,000 Endowment minimum. They founded the Fairfax County Alumnae Chapter in 2012, and last year, Gamma Phi Beta Foundation Trustee, Margaret Myers, proposed re-naming the Endowment the Fairfax Virginia Loyalty Grant Endowment to represent the women who originally established the endowment. In March 2022, it was approved by the Foundation Board, and the \$30,000.00 Endowment, now named for the women who established it, generates a \$1,500.00 Grant annually.
